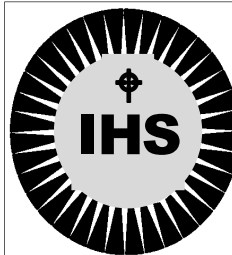

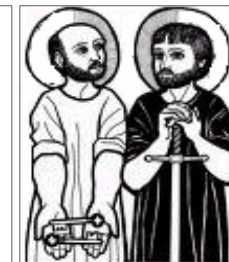

The Catholic Diocese of Auckland and the Holy Name Parish in Warkworth have gone unconditional on the acquisition of 480 Matakana Road.

A consultation process with parishioners ran through June to explore the option of buying the former Ascension Winery. This resulted in an 85% support for the purchase from the consultation.

Settlement is no earlier than 29 November 2024, the beginning of a new liturgical year for the church. In declaring 2025 a Jubilee Year of Prayer Pope Francis said:

"We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision." This purchase is an opportunity for the Catholic community of Warkworth to be renewed in hope, trust and vision. A process to commence sale of the parish's current sites is expected to begin in the coming months.

Scripture Note:

First Reading (Ezekiel 2:2-5). God sends a prophet to his people to ensure that they do not remain in ignorance of their disobedience. A biblical prophet is someone who has received a divine call to speak God's word to his people. Even though the word of God could be a hard word, it was a word of love because it meant that God had not abandoned his people. God's spokesman had to be prepared for opposition and rejection. It was so for the Old Testament prophets, and for Jesus himself, as we see in the Gospel.

Second Reading (2 Corinthians 12:7-10). Paul's experience of weakness ('a thorn in the flesh') taught him humility, and allowed him to experience God's power in a way that might not otherwise have been possible. The words 'my grace is sufficient for you' are spoken to us too, and should be a great consolation to us in our struggles.

Gospel (Mark 6:1-6). True to the proverb that no prophet is honoured by his own people, Jesus is rejected by the people of Nazareth. At the close of his Galilean ministry, Jesus is rejected by the people of his hometown, who can't bring themselves to believe in the greatness of someone who is one of themselves. Consequently, his power is ineffective there. Their rejection of him is an anticipation of his rejection by the Jewish nation as a whole. Christians today should not grow discouraged by lack of belief or rejection.
